Re: Formal Consultation, 2010 Salmon Recovery Grants

Dear Chair Burnett,

I am writing to initiate formal tribal consultation as described in the Governor's Executive Order 05-05 on Archeological and Cultural Resources for the projects listed on the attached pages. At its December 10, 2010 meeting, the Salmon Recovery Funding Board (SRFB) approved grants for these projects.

On the listing, several project types are noted, including land acquisition, restoration, assessment, design, enhancement, and those needing a federal permit. Of these, we have used bold typeface to highlight those undergoing the review process outlined in the Executive Order. Many of the non-bolded projects either do not call for ground disturbance at this time (though the resulting design could involve ground disturbance if funding is awarded in the future), or are slated for a separate federal review/permit process. For the federal review projects, we welcome you to comment now or wait to be engaged in the federal process.

Tribal views are an important part of the analysis as we work with grant recipients toward implementing these projects. *I would very much appreciate your response to this letter in the next 30 days so we can determine whether the projects may proceed.* It would be especially helpful if you could assist us in making this determination by telling us:

- 1. For which of these projects, if any, does your tribe have cultural resource concerns?
- 2. What, if any, known cultural resources would be affected?
- 3. What, if any, additional information do you need?
- 4. Who would be our primary contact with your tribe?
