We are, along with Island County, the largest land holders of Swan Lake. Scott and I are very much in support of the grant application by SLWPG to restore and enhance the current saltwater connection joining the lake with Puget Sound on the west side of Whidbey Island. As members of the SLWPG and residents with property adjoining the lake, we appreciate the critical nature of preserving and enhancing watersheds and ecosystems without which life here on the island would be detrimentally affected. This estuary is one of very few left in our state. Currently, we enjoy beautiful fields that host a myriad of bats, wild birds and major raptors such as eagles, hawks and owls. We also enjoy seeing coyotes and deer. Each and every day it is a pleasure to look out and see the fields and lake; we also enjoy seeing birds nesting and using the lake as a residence or as a quiet and plentiful respite on a long migratory journey.

We have been troubled by the rampant and poorly planned growth of Oak Harbor. Our family has held ownership of this land for nearly 40 years and feel this critical watershed will be adversely affected or destroyed by over development. In addition, we are very concerned about the future health of Puget Sound and the living creatures in it.
