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1 of 4 Are there any significant challenges that might hinder progress or keep you from meeting your project milestones? If so, please tell us about them. At this time, we do not anticipate any significant challenges that will hinder progress towards project completion in 2012. That said, the project was denied streamlined status for permitting via the Fish Habitat Exemption by Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife. This means applying for local permits through Island County which could delay progress but this remains unknown at this time. Permits were submitted in November and December 2011.

2 of 4 Describe the work accomplished during this reporting period.

The design firm for the project, Coast and Harbor Engineering, began design work in July 2011 and permit-level design was completed in November 2011. Also, Cascadia Archaelogy was hired and completed a site assessment and survey related to Cultural Resources in September and October 2011. TNC and NOAA shared this assessment and survey with Department of Historical Preservation (DAHP) and DAHP concurred with the determination of No Historic Properties Affected but have requested a professional archaeological monitoring plan. In November 2011 permits were submitted to Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. WDFW determined that the project was not eligible for the streamlined JARPA process via the Fish Habitat Exemption. This has necessitated submission of local permits to Island County that were submitted in November and December 2011. Lastly, TNC has finalized contracting with Herrera to

complete construction oversight and management

services during construction.

4 of 4 Tell us about work planned for the next reporting period. During the next reporting period we anticipate completing all necessary work leading up to beginning of restoration. All permits will be received and finalized. Design plans will be finalized based on comments from permitting agencies. Final design will allow TNC to put construction contract out to bid and hire a construction contractor.

Yes	Multiple local permits have been submitted to Island County due to WDFW's determination that the project does not meet criteria for use of the streamlined JARPA process. Island County is determining exactly which local permits will be required and in the meantime we have applied for all potential permits that may be needed including: Clearing and Grading, Critical Areas Alteration, Critical Areas Permitting Use, Shoreline Exemption, and Master Land Development permit.
3 of 3	Tell us about your progress with securing your permits or ESA consultation.		As of December 8th, all permits have been submitted to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), WDFW, and Island County and they are being reviewed and processed. NOAA is working with TNC to consult with Department of Archaelogy and Historic Preservation and Tribes regarding Section 106 as well as U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Army Corps of Engineers for ESA Consultation.
