Yes

Project team was delayed by one month in meeting the Cultural Resources review milestone. Cultural Resources review has now been completed and submitted to RCO Project Manager.

The City of Edmonds conducted a competitive bid process and selected Shannon and Wilson to provide consulting services for this phase of work. This selection also allows a seemless flow from the previous project phase into this phase by having the same consultant. Consultant completed and submitted a Cultural Resources review per RCO requirements prior to any ground disturbing activities. This review included a geotechnical exploration plan and background information with an archaeologist performing the site visit. Consultant has provided a survey plan and basemaps for site surveys. Consultant has begun work on beach outlet connection, which will evaluate and model beach outlet alternatives. Consultant has also begun a geologic soils review and is coordinating a plan for geotechnical field explorations. The project team also met with representatives from Chevron to discuss the Unocal Oil property. Chevron and their consultants were able to provide our project team with extensive CAD files of the Unocal site for the contaminated soils review. Based on this information, our consutlant will not need to access the Unocal site to conduct any soil borings and the contaminated soils review will be completed using this data.

4 of 4 Tell us about work planned for the next reporting period.

During the next reporting period, we anticipate having a fully executed Cultural Resources review with DAHP. This will allow our consultant to begin the geotechnical field explorations of the Marina Beach Park area. We anticipate the beach outlet alignment alternatives study and hydraulic modeling will be completed shortly thereafter. Our constultant will use the data provided by Chevron of the Unocal site to complete the contaminated soils review. We have begun outreach to adjacent landowners and anticipate meetings with WSDOT and Ecology (regarding the Unocal site) in the coming months. We are on target to complete the Final Feasibility study by the end of the next reporting period.
