Dear Mr. Fordjour:

The City of Edmonds has submitted an application to the State's Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) for funding through the Salmon Recovery Funding Board (SRFB) to restore salmon access and improve flood conditions associated with Edmonds Marsh and the Willow and Shellabarger Creek watersheds

The City is currently working on the final feasibility study for this project, which would improve marsh conditions by daylighting Willow Creek from the Edmonds Marsh to Puget Sound via a new open channel/creek connection (See attached figure). The alignment of this proposed channel is in agreement with the same found in the *SR104*, *Edmonds Crossing, Final Environmental Impact Statement and Final Section 4(f) Evaluation*¹. The proposed open channel would run under the BNSF Railway tracks through the trestles constructed in 2011 by Sound Transit as part of mitigation for the Everett to Seattle Sounder train. The City is applying to RCO at this time for funding to support initial design and permitting efforts for this project.

We are providing you with this letter as an adjacent property owner to inform you that future implementation of this restoration action would require collaboration between WSDOT Ferries and the City of Edmonds.
