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Amendment 3 to PSMFC Grant No. 18-31G
Monitoring the Effectiveness of Salmon Habitat Restoration
Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office
PSMFC Job 1101B.21

This Amendment No. 3 to PSMFC Grant No. 18-31G is entered into between the **Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission** ("PSMFC") and the **Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office** ("Grantee") in order to amend the terms of the original agreement. The purpose of this Amendment is to extend the period of performance to June 30, 2021 and add an additional \$291,000 in program funding.

Accordingly, the terms of Grant No. 18-31G are hereby amended as follows (amended items in bold):

1) **ARTICLE II: STATEMENT OF WORK:** Article II is amended to read:

"Grantee shall conduct and complete the tasks and activities described in the Statement of Work (Exhibit A) and **Statement of Work Addenda (Exhibits A-1, A-2 and A-3)** that are attached and incorporated herein."

2) **ARTICLE III: PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE:** Article III is amended to read:

"The performance period for this agreement is March 1, 2017 through ~~June 30, 2020~~ **June 30, 2021.**"

3) **ARTICLE IV: COSTS AND TERMS OF PAYMENT:** Article IV is amended to read:

"Upon receipt and approval of invoices for services satisfactorily rendered, PSMFC agrees to reimburse Grantee for actual expenditures incurred in accordance with the rates specified in the attached Budget Detail. Grantee shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred during the performance of this agreement, not to exceed customary charges for such expenses. Travel costs shall be at rates not to exceed those amounts paid to Washington State employees under collective bargaining agreements currently in effect. Payment for services performed is inclusive of all costs including labor, fringe, supplies, travel and overhead and shall not exceed ~~\$873,000~~ **\$1,164,000** in the aggregate in accordance with the budget."

4) **ARTICLE VIII: REPORTS:** The reporting schedule listed in Article VIII is amended to read:


- "1) a report for the July 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017 period is due January 15, 2018
- 2) a report for the January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018 period due July 15, 2018
- 3) a report for the July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018 period due January 15, 2019
- 4) a report for the January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019 period due July 15, 2019
- 5) a report for the July 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 period is due January 15, 2020
- 6) a report for the January 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020 period due July 15, 2020
- 7) a report for the July 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 period due January 15, 2021
- 8) a report for the January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021 period due July 15, 2021"

This Amendment represents the full extent of any changes to Grant No. 18-31G intended by this action and the remainder of the terms of this grant shall remain unchanged unless otherwise amended.


