The Eagle Tree Estates Homeowners Association (ETEHA) would like to express our support of the Skagit River System Cooperative's (SRSC) proposal to initiate restoration activity in the Arrowhead Lagoon. Based upon our preliminary conversations with SRSC, we understand that a redesigned trail that requires removal of fill and a failed culvert, would allow for both maximum tidal exchange for fish and safe access to the beach for association members, including ATV access. We also understand that SCSC is interested in restoring the inner lagoon area for refuge, foraging and rearing habitat for salmon and other fish species.

Home owners have expressed concerns about the potential for increased salt water intrusion into our water supply and septic systems; the effects of increased water movements as it relates to the bluff and areas beyond the dike; the quality of the bridge and trail as compared to the existing facilities; conservation of all rights of private ownership to include the limitation of access to property owners exclusively and concerns about liability during and after the restoration project is completed. We are confident that the research required for the completion of this project will resolve all of these concerns.

My understanding is that you would like to be able to access the project area through my property at the east end of Ski Yu Drive. The proposed restoration activities include removal of fill at the existing trail, construction of a wider bridge to span the lagoon inlet, and removal of fill along the inner lagoon shoreline.
