#### Sockeye season ends

LAKE WENATCHEE —
The sockeye salmon season
on Lake Wenatchee will
end one hour after official
sunset today.

According to a state
Department of Fish and
Wildlife press release, a
high rate of sockeye mortality up the Wenatchee River
has occurred during migration due to high water temperatures, making for insufficient numbers of sockeye
to continue the sport-fishing season in the lake.

Though it wasn't originally scheduled to open this summer, the sockeye season on Lake Wenatchee opened last Wednesday because the 2009 return of sockeye had met spawning escapement goals.

To date, anglers have caught 2,040 sockeye in the lake.
